■ Objective

To show the situation and thinking of working people in the Tokyo metropolitan area of Japan.

■Survey Target Population

Regular/permanent employees, contract/non-regular employees, temporary employees, part-timers and freelancers within a 50 km radius of the Tokyo metropolitan area (Tokyo Prefecture, Kanagawa Prefecture, Chiba Prefecture, Saitama Prefecture).

Males and females age 18-59 who worked at least 1 day in the final week of August 2012 (excluding students).

■Sample Sizes

9,790 (Male: 5,631, Female: 4,159) (Non-weighted data from 2006)

■ Sampling

Divided into regular/permanent employee and part-time groups, and by gender and age in 5-year intervals. The part-time groups are "Contract/non-regular employees", "Dispatch agency temporary employees", "Part-time", "Other part-time (arbeit)" and "Freelancer".

■Survey Period

September 19-27, 2012

■ Methodology

3) Family composition

- In China, Germany and Russia, the proportion of respondents who said they "Have a spouse (married)" was high at over 60%, and in Russia, the proportion of respondents who said they "Have children" was high at just under 50%.
- On the other hand, in Korea, Thailand and Japan, the proportion of respondents who said they "Have a spouse (married)" was low at 20 to 30% and the proportion of respondents who said they "Have children" was also low at 10 to 20%.
- ♦ By age, a higher proportion of people in their 20s than in their 30s said that they "Live with parents" or "Live alone," but in India, there was also a high proportion of people in their 30s who said that they "Live with parents" at 46.1%.

♦ In China, the highest proportion of respondents said that their income (income from main job) was "100,000 or more, and less than 130,000 yuan" at 20.1%, followed by "40,000 or more, and less than 70,000 yuan" (15.4%), then "70,000 or more, and less than 100,000 yuan" (14.5%), so that the range of "40,000 or more, and less 130,000 yuan" accounted for approximately 50%.

- ♦ In Korea, the highest proportion of respondents said that their income (income from their main job) was "20 million or more, and less than 30 million won," at 22.6%, followed by "30 million or more, and less than 40 million won" (19.2%). Combined, these two income ranges accounted for approximately 42% of respondents.
- ♦ While 28.5% of women said that their income was "20 million or more, and less than 30 million won," only 16.5% of men said the same, a gap of 12 points.

- ♦ The proportion of people in their 20s who said that their income was "500,000 or more, and less than 600,000 rupees" was highest at 12.5%, while the proportion of people in their 30s who said that their income was "1 million or more, and less than 2 million rupees" was highest at 13.6%.

- ♦ The proportion of people in their 20s who said that their income was "2000 or more, and less than 3000 ringgit" was highest at 26.6%, followed by "3000 or more, and less than 4000 ringgit" at 16.7%. On the other hand, the proportion of people in their 30s who said that their income was "3000 or more, and less than 4000 ringgit" was highest at 14.2%, followed by "5000 or more, and less than 10,000 ringgit" and "50,000 or more, and less than 70,000 ringgit" both at 11.4%.

- ◆ In China, a higher proportion of men than women said that they worked in "Government/public-operated" or "Private (domestic capital)" workplaces, while the proportion of women who said that they worked in a "Private (foreign capital)" workplace was 34.0%, more than 10 points higher than men.

- ♦ In all countries, the proportion of people in their 30s who had changed jobs since graduation was higher than the proportion of people in their 20s who had done the same, and in Korea and Japan, the proportion of people in their 30s who had changed jobs since graduation was over 30 points higher than the proportion of people in their 20s who had done the same.

2) Number of jobs quit by those who have quit a job

- ◆ In almost all countries, the number of job changes for people who had changed jobs since graduation was "one change" or "two changes," which when combined comprised around 50 to 60% of respondents.
- On the other hand, in China, Germany and Japan, the number of job changes was "one change" or "two changes" for over 70% of respondents and the average number of job changes was 2.0 or less.
- ◆ In Japan, the number respondents in their 20s who said that their number of job changes since graduation was "one change" was noticeably high at 70%.

3) Use of career consultants

- ◆ In China and India, regarding contacting a career consultant, around 40% of respondents said that they had "Contacted only when you searched for or changed jobs," while around 20% said that they "Contact even when you have no plans to search for or change jobs," to make a combined total of over half of respondents who had some sort of relationship with a career consultant
- ♦ On the other hand, in Korea, Thailand, Russia and Japan, relationships with career consultants were rare with over 20% even choosing the answer, "You do not know what a career consultant is."

♦ In India, the proportion of people who responded "Contact even when you have no plans to search for or change jobs" regarding a career consultant was higher for people in their 30s than for people in their 20s by approximately 9 points.

1. The important things with regards to working

- In most countries, respondents said that they thought the most important thing with regards to working was "High salary, substantial employee benefits and welfare."
- On the other hand, the most popular response for people in the United States, Australia and Japan was "Work that you want to do," while for people from Germany the most popular response was "Employment stability."
- ♦ In the United States and Australia, the proportion of women who answered "Work that you want to do" was around 30%, over 10 points higher than men who answered the same in those countries.
- ◆ In Japan, the proportion of women who said "Appropriate work hours and holidays" was 19%, over 10 points higher than that of men.

- ♦ If one combines the responses given for what people thought was the 1st to 3rd most important thing with regards to working, the highest proportion of respondents in all countries except for Japan said that it was "High salary, substantial benefits and welfare," and in particular, in China, Korea, Russia and each of the countries of Southeast Asia, the proportion who said this was over 70%.
- ◆ In Japan, people said that the most important thing regard to working was "Good personal relations at the workplace" at 56.0%, which was followed by "Work that you want to do" (51.3%), then "Appropriate work hours and holidays" (49.0%),
- For respondents in Vietnam, the proportion of people who answered "Education and training opportunities" was very high at 44.4%, in second place after the most popular response of "High salary, substantial benefits and welfare."
- ♦ The proportion of women who said that the most important thing with regard to working was "Good personal relations at the workplace" and "Appropriate work hours and holidays" was higher than that of men in almost all countries. Women in Germany who said that "Good personal relations at the workplace" were most important and women in Japan and Korea who said that "Appropriate work hours and holidays" were most important were over 10 points higher than the proportion of men who said the same in their respective countries.
- ◆ In almost all countries more men than women answered that a "Clear career path" was most important, and in China, Indonesia, Vietnam and Australia the proportion of men who said this was over 10 points higher than that of women.

Desired working style

As a desired working style, when asked if they would like to "A: Work globally" or "B: Work concentrated in a certain region" around 70% of respondents from India, Thailand, Malaysia and Indonesia said "Closer to A" or "If you had to choose, closer to A." India was particularly high with a combined total of 80%.

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- To the same question, respondents from Korea, Vietnam, the United States, Germany, Russia and Japan, said they would prefer "B: Work concentrated in a certain region," with people who answered "Closer to B," or "If you had to choose, closer to B" constituting over half of respondents.
- To the same question, many more respondents from Vietnam in their 30s answered "B: Work concentrated in a certain region," with the proportion answering "Closer to B" reaching over half of respondents, more than 15 points higher than that of people in their 20s answering the same.

- ♦ "Hong Kong" was popular as the destination country for living overseas for respondents from China, and for respondents from Malaysia and Indonesia "Singapore," was popular, while for respondents from Germany within "Europe" had the highest proportion of responses, indicating a noticeable trend of living overseas in a neighboring country.

- Regarding whether they would like to be assigned to China, affirmative responses were high for people from Hong Kong, with 44.4% answering that they "Would willingly work there," and 48.8% responding that they "Wouldn't mind working there," to make a total of over 90%.
- ◆ In Japan, there was a relatively high proportion of people who wished to be assigned to India and each of the countries of Southeast Asia, with those responding that they "Would willingly work there," or that they "Wouldn't mind working there," making a total of around 80% for each. In particular, for Vietnam, the proportion of people who said that they "Would willingly work there," was high at almost half of respondents.
